#### **Tuition and Fees:**

For a complete list of student fees and for a per-credit-hour breakdown of tuition rates, please refer to the University's <u>Comprehensive Fee Schedule</u>. Students complete a combination of graduate level and undergraduate level courses.

Estimated living expenses (includes room, board, medical insurance, food, etc): \$9,425 for the fall and spring semesters; \$3,105 for the summer term

Estimated costs of books, supplies, and field trips: \$1,800 for an academic year. Additionally, there is a one-time required computer purchase.

#### **Student Retention and Graduation Rates:**

The retention rate for a master's program is the percentage of first year students who return the next academic year. The graduation rate for a master's program is the percentage of students who graduate within 4 years of enrolling.

### **Scholarships Awarded:**

48 scholarships have been awarded to Landscape Architecture students for the 2018-2019 academic year, for a total of \$75,412.

## **Employment Rate:**

The Employment Rate measures the percentage of MLA graduates who obtain landscape architecture positions or elect to pursue an advanced degree within one year of graduation.

93% of 2018 graduates were employed in a full-time landscape architecture position within one year of graduation.
